We continue to hear from listeners about our two new program schedules! Thank you for all your feedback. Many listeners have been happy with the new classical channel and many more appreciate that they now have a constant choice in what to listen to! Two broad areas are worth re-emphasizing, both in

regards to being able to easily access our new Maine Public Classical Channel. First – we are aware that the four (at this writing) Maine Public Classical FM stations do not cover all areas of Maine. Our goal is to further grow our new network so that we can share this wonderful service with more listeners in more areas of our state.

The second item is about HD radio. Many listeners have never heard of HD radio, and perhaps don't have any desire to update existing radios with HD technology. We understand that. However, many listeners who have tried HD radio are extremely happy they did. They can now hear our classical service in all areas of the state – crystal clear – where we now broadcast our Maine Public Radio signal! And many of these relatively inexpensive HD receivers can be easily connected to many existing home stereos.

Classical listeners please note: We've heard you. You can now find the radio listings for our two weekly operas and our evening concert programs on page 21 of *Experience!*

With the political conventions over, August brings us several **American Experience** programs on six U.S. presidents. Please check the listings, some programs start at 8:00 p.m. and others at 9:00. Second Century Stewardship: Science Beyond the Scenery

also to benefit park stewardship through scientific research and the discipline of scientific thinking. This year's centennial celebration for the National Park Service provides a wonderful historic opportunity to appreciate the value of our national parks and to explore critical issues for the next century. I believe that the future of parks will benefit dramatically from scientific perspectives, and that exploring science in the parks will benefit society, including science education. Science and parks are two subjects close to my heart, and I'm pleased to share this enthusiasm with others.

How do you approach the project from the initial stages? Do you have it fully mapped out or does it progress along organically?

At the outset, for a project of this kind, I like to fully explore the nature of the opportunity, engaging others in that creative process. Great initial planning is often a critical success factor. Despite that planning, this project, like many, evolved significantly over two years, including linkage of our filmmaking project to the powerful park science collaboration that we created and announced in June. That project, Second Century Stewardship, is led by a team representing the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Acadia National Park, Schoodic Institute and the National Park Service.

What were some things you discovered along the way that surprised you?

I'm quite new to filmmaking so there can often be surprises with an ambitious

David, what inspired you to take on this project?

The Second Century Stewardship collaboration was inspired by my own visits to marine and terrestrial parks around the world, where the lens of science has dramatically enriched my experiences. Exploring parks with the benefit of scientific perspectives takes me far beyond the amazing scenery and

helps me better understand and appreciate the beauty and the value of these special places.

As a trustee of the National Park Foundation and as Treasurer of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, I saw an opportunity to inspire others through science-based park experiences, and

project like this. One example was the challenge in clearly communicating certain points about science issues in the parks. For the first time, I used animation to help with this. The creation of an original soundtrack was also challenging, but, ultimately, a wonderful creative exercise. We had a very talented team. I contributed on drums and harmonica.

What should our viewers look for when watching this film?

Look for the inspirational impact of these park experiences on students, documented in our film segments. Watch for the enthusiasm generated by these experiences, and for the sense of caring and stewardship that comes with higher levels of understanding and appreciation.

What would be the one takeaway that you hope our viewers come to appreciate?

Our national parks belong to all Americans. I hope that this film will help people experience parks with that ownership mindset, exploring more deeply beyond the beautiful scenery to better understand, through the lens of science, how we can protect and be inspired by these special places.

What projects lie ahead for you?

Completion of this film marks the launch of our Second Century Stewardship collaboration. What lies ahead is an exciting journey of important park science research projects and to engage the power of science to benefit visitors, science education and park policy. ■
